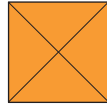
A. Tear off the chatterbox



B. Turn it over and fold bottom left to top right



C. Fold bottom right to top left



D. Unfold it back to a square



E. Fold all corners to the middle



F. It should look like this



G. Next, turn it over



H. Fold each corner to the middle



I. Fold in half one way, then the other



J. Finished!

- 1 Choose one of the four animals or spirits and spell it out loud, opening and closing the chatterbox with each letter
- 2 Choose a descriptive word
- 3 Find an artwork that YOU think best matches your two words
- 4 Stand in front of the artwork, then lift the flap and follow the instructions underneath
- 5 Switch players and repeat!
- 6 Listen to the name of your animal or spirit in the glossary of johnmawurndjul.com or turn over to learn more
