

Collaged Daffodils!

You will need:

- daffodil outline, printed or traced onto white A4 paper
- a pencil or black marker
- coloured paper (1 x sheet of each colour): dark & light yellow, dark & light green. If you don't have coloured paper, look for these colours in an old newspaper or magazine
- 1 x glue stick
- sheets of newspaper
- 1 x pair of scissors
- pastels, coloured pencils or coloured markers

The Flowers



1. Following the images above, tear small pieces of dark yellow paper and paste onto the inner part of the daffodil cup.

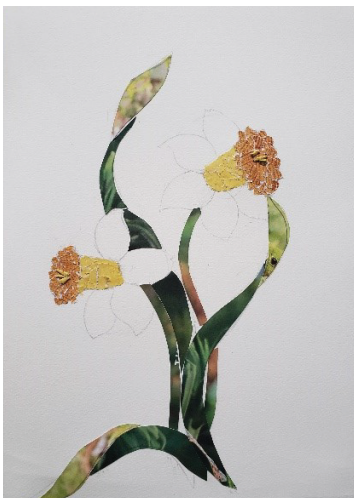
2. Next, tear pieces of light yellow and paste to fill the remaining part of the cup. Repeat steps 1 and 2 for both the cups.

3. Tear pieces of newspaper and paste onto the petals of the daffodils. Use a yellow pencil or marker to give the petals a little border.

Tip!

To maintain the shape of the flower, try to collage within the lines and follow the curves of the drawing.

The Leaves



4. You can follow the same process of tearing and gluing using green paper, or cut out the shape of the leaves from green paper and stick them onto your collage. Following the images above, use light green on the outer folded part and dark green in the inner parts of the leaves. Also cover the stems in any green you like.

The Background



5. Tear pieces of newspaper and paste down to fill the background, or use pencils and markers to make your own background!
