

On Death and Dying

Written and composed by Natalie Afaj, Rachael Borg, Peter Mitousis Kothe, with the addition of Year 11 performer Max Corby.

A grief support group welcomes four individuals who present their experiences to each other as well as the audience. They discuss their own stage of grief, the cause of their grief and attempt to connect with the audience by sharing. Each of the stories highlights how grief connects everyone and how grief isn't always caused by the death of a loved one. In doing so, the characters validate their own stories, and the stories personal to those in the audience, achieved through the use of satire and serious themes. As the story progresses, we see how grief connects us all, no matter how different the experiences.
