Colley Street Bushland Reserve Colley Street Pearcedale, VIC 3912

Take a stroll on the boardwalk to observe the different habitat layers in this remnant patch of heathy woodland. A haven for small birds, lizards, insects and even the odd Koala (Phascolarctos cinereus). From August to November the Wedding Bush (Ricinocarpos pinifolius) are covered in a mass of fragrant white flowers.





Although small in size, pocket reserves like Bellbird Nature Reserve play an important role in urban biodiversity by providing food and shelter for wildlife. The reserve is dominated by eucalyptus trees, sheoaks and acacias and demonstrates what the landscape originally looked like. It is also home to some very special indigenous grasses and wildflowers that were once common in the undergrowth around Berwick.



Blind Bight Foreshore Reserve Anchorage Drive Blind Bight, VIC 3980

This 35.5 hectares of bushland is renowned for its rare and threatened wildlife - and abundant indigenous orchids and wildflowers in Spring. A great place to explore Casey's remarkable coastline and a hot spot for bird watching all year round.

Casuarina Forest Nature Reserve 66 William Hovell Drive Endeavour Hills, VIC 3802

This nature reserve is a window into how the natural landscape once looked. With its grassy woodland vegetation, it offers a quiet and relaxing place to visit. Listen for the wind blowing through the needles of the Black Sheoak (Allocasuarina *littoralis*). Bursting from the understory with colour are many native flowering plants including the Grass Trigger Plant (Stylidium graminifolium), Pale Vanilla-lily (Arthropodium milleflorum), flax lilies and Austral Indigo (Indigofera australis).

Cranbourne Botanic Gardens 1000 Ballarto Road Cranbourne, VIC 3977
